

# West Wight Timebank July 2022 Newsletter

#### Food Redistribution

There is a growing need for us all to support each other in these difficult times, and the West Wight Timebank's philosophy of sharing skills and kindness will certainly be supportive of the various schemes that help distribute food in the West Wight.

Faith will be at the Parish Hall with her food van at 2pm as usual throughout July, so please do spread the word as it is available to all on a 'pay as you feel basis'. It is also of huge importance for us all to help save food waste, so Sally and Alison have increased their pick ups from Sainsbury's local from 5 to 7 days a week, to meet increased demand.

The West Wight Timebank is now registered with Neighbourly, a not for profit organisation founded in 2014 to help businesses deliver meaningful and sustainable community investment. They manage the food good to eat that Sainsburys have left over each day, and now manage the distribution of the food.

This means for us, that they send a message to say if there is food to collect every day, which Sally can either accept or decline. If declined, it will go to the next collecting organisation on their list.

# Food Pantry

We are so pleased that Natalie Thomas, a local councillor and Freshwater Parish Council are working hard to set up a food pantry in the West Wight, which would provide roughly £15 of food purchased for £5 and be open to all who join the scheme, which is supported financially at present by the IOW council.

Food poverty is not going to go away, so the Timebank is asking all members to support Natalie in her quest. Currently she is in the process of securing a community venue for the pantry, so more details will be shared as this develops

Food parcels



The Timebank made up 259 food parcels at the Parish Hall and delivered to local families from January to June 2022, which is wonderful. Grants from IOW council were secured for this.

Sally will now be starting to spend the £1000 grant from Tesco's for further parcels (12 a week) to see the families through the summer.

Heather, the family liaison officer and Sally will then consider if any of the families still need deliveries, or if they can (hopefully) go to the food pantry. If there is still a need for deliveries, Sally will then apply for a small grant to be able to continue to donate £5 per parcel for Faith's food.







Gina and Davina use donated fabrics to make bags for the wellbeing boxes, aprons to sell, and hand-made dresses to order.

Fern, is trying to recruit more repairers to join the Repair Café, so if you would like to do this, please let Sally know as it would be good to have more members involved in this to help mend items.

#### Drop and Swap table

As we haven't a lot of storage space at the hall (in the cupboard of plenty!), Chris and Sally have decided that any items on the table that are not taken within a month, will be taken by Lee to a car boot sale, and any money made will be put towards Timebank funds.

Jane, set up the first food pantry on the island, which is a remarkable achievement, and Sally is so looking forward to sharing ideas with Jane about schemes that make communities grow in strength.

Monique will be running her Timebank from Oakfield Primary School where she also runs a food pantry. She thanked Sally for her time and knowledge when training.

Sally notes that in other countries she knows of Timebanks that run just within a school, and ask each child to say 2 things they are good at, and 1 they need help with. The coordinator then matches them up, so that for some of a 1 lunchtime, once a week they can share their skills together.

This seems a fab way to promote sharing, kindness, empathy and respect in our younger people  $\odot$ 

Thanks to Aspire who commissioned Sally to run this training, and who are paying for all 3 to have a years membership with TBUK, so that they can access further training, particularly the software package that we all use to store members credits safely.



Sally adds, that for her, the training was an amazing bench -mark, as she has been trying to encourage other island Timebanks for 5 years now, having got part way to set up one in Newport, on two separate occasions.

So well worth celebrating, and we can of course link up, when Jane, Tricia and Monique get going.

This month we have exchanged a lot of time credits between us! 326, which added to our running total gives us almost 14,000 hours since we started the Timebank. Thankyou to all members who continue to put requests in , and spend their credits too.

Our Timebank Workshops and Community Vouchers are a great way to spend your credits, so please do put your name down for one or two.

# Our Allotment


